SYNOPSIS

This story follows a widowered and poverty-stricken carpenter, who is tasked to build his wife's coffin for her burial in two days. In order to fully do so, he has to go through the different stages of grief, and connect with his inner-self where he realizes that the False prophet had a hand in the wife's passing.



DIRECTORS NOTE

The thing that inspired our/Skhona/Omolemo concept is both our experiences and the recent telling of the happenings within evangelical churches that subscribe to the prosperity gospel. Seeing the way rich, false prophets exploit the desperation of poor and vulnerable people in the rural areas really triggered an empathy for the family members left to deal with the pain the false prophets leave behind them. For example, Prophet Paseka "Mboro" Motsoeneng recently claimed to have gone to heaven and sold pictures he took there for R5 000, and said entrance to heaven cost R10 000, scamming his congregation, and a follower of Pastor Chris Oyakhilome died after not taking medication, believing the pastor had healed her of tuberculosis. Therefore, with the film, we aim to highlight how the family of the victims of these false prophets are left behind to deal with the pain brought upon by the ways of prosperity gospel.
